Subject: Training Program on the System of Environmental-Economic Accounting Central Framework (SEEA-CF) and environment-related Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) indicators for countries of Eastern Europe, the Caucasus and Central Asia

Dear colleague,

It is our pleasure to announce the launch of a Training Program on the SEEA-CF and environment-related SDG indicators for countries of Eastern Europe, the Caucasus and Central Asia (EECCA), organized by the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD) with support of the Central Bureau of Statistics of Netherlands.

The training is a response to the request from EECCA countries to provide training on SEEA and its links with environment-related SDG indicators. It is complementary to activities in the region carried out by UNECE, UNESCAP, UNDP, UNEP, UNSD and the World Bank.

The training programme is based on a blended learning format consisting of the following three phases:

- 1. An online course: The online course will provide an overview on the SEEA-CF and covers topics such as physical flow accounts, environmental asset accounts and environmental activity accounts. The online course is expected to begin in the second half of October 2017.
- An on-site training: A subset of participants from countries that have demonstrated, through ongoing initiatives and plans, a strong commitment to implement the SEEA will be selected to attend a face-to-face seminar to further deepen their knowledge about the SEEA.
- 3. A follow-up phase: In the last phase, participating countries are expected to take follow-up actions such as conducting a national training workshop on SEEA and formulating a national strategy and work plan for the implementation of SEEA.
